Lessons From Songs

“Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts.” - (Colossians 4:16)

Paul encouraged us to teach and admonish one another through the songs that we sing. There are great lessons to be learned from the songs that we encourage each other with and lift up to God in worship. As we work through our study of the Holy Spirit, let’s be reminded of some of these lessons from some of the songs we have encouraged each other with many times.

“His blood has washed our sins away, His Spirit turned our night to day, And now we can rejoice to say That God is love.” - (God is Love)

“When you met with great temptation, Did you think to pray? By His dying love and merit, Did you claim the Holy Spirit As your guide and stay?” - (Did You Think to Pray?)

“‘Give me thy heart,’ says the Spirit divine, ‘All that thou hast, to my keeping resign; Grace more abounding is mine to impart, Make full surrender and give me thy heart.’” - (Give Me Thy Heart)

“Have Thine own way, Lord! Have Thine own way! Hold o’er my being Absolute sway! Fill with Thy Spirit Till all shall see Christ only, always, Living in me.” - (Have Thine Own Way, Lord)

“I know not how the Spirit moves, Convincing men of sin, Revealing Jesus thro’ the word, Creating faith in Him. But ‘I know whom I have believed, And am persuaded that He is able To keep that which I’ve committed Unto Him against that day.’” - (I Know Not Why God’s Wondrous Grace)

“Standing on the promises I cannot fall, List’ning ev’ry moment to the Spirit’s call, Resting in my Savior as my all in all, Standing on the promises of God.” - (Standing on the Promises)

GOD IS NIGH

The earliest official reference to using “Taps” at a military funeral is described in an 1891 manual. During the Civil War, a Union soldier “was buried at a time when the battery occupied an advanced position concealed in the woods.” Because it wasn’t safe to fire the customary three volleys over the grave, Captain John Tidball decided the sounding of “Taps” would be an appropriate substitute ceremony.



Previously, “Taps” signaled the end of a soldier’s work day, but it has since come to honor the end of his or her earthly life. Horace Trim’s lyrics remind us of God’s constant presence:

Day is done, gone the sun
 From the lakes, from the hills, from the sky
 All is well, safely rest
 God is nigh.

Thanks and praise for our days
 'Neath the sun, 'neath the stars, 'neath the sky
 As we go, this we know
 God is nigh.

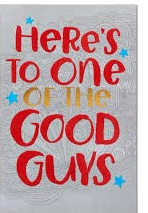
