WE HAVE NOTHING TO COMPLAIN ABOUT

In 1988, a Polish railway worker named Jan Grzebski was hit by a train. Somehow he managed to survive; but he fell into a coma. While it was reported that the coma was the result of the accident, it was actually a result of a brain tumor. Even though doctors did not expect him to survive, aging allowed the tumor to shrink and pressure to be relieved from the brain stem. He regained some consciousness in 1992, and completely came out of his coma in 2007. For 19 years he was in a coma.

Before passing away in 2008, Grzebski spoke of how things were different. When he finally awoke in 2007, it was whole new world. When he fell into the coma he had 4 children. When he awoke, he had eleven grandchildren. He spoke particularly about the changes in Poland. In 1988, Poland was a communist state. He noted that back then meat was rationed and there were huge lines at nearly every gas station. He said, "...there was only tea and vinegar in the shops."

In 2007, he awoke to a free nation where he said there were "...people on the streets with cell phones and there are so many goods in the shops it makes my head spin." He went on to say, "What amazes me is all these people who walk around with their mobile phones and never stop moaning. I've got nothing to complain about." - (https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Jan_Grzebski)

These people had freedom and food and wealth greater than Poland had experienced for decades. But when Grzebski awoke from his coma he found people that only seemed to want to complain about what they did not have.

This time of year we try to remain mindful of the blessings we do have. But we can sometimes fall into the trap of focusing on all the things we want that we don't have. Someone has said, "If you don't get into the habit of thanking God for what you DO have, you'll soon become ungrateful because of what you DON'T have."

As the Christmas season is upon us and many in the world pause to think upon the birth of Jesus, let us be mindful of just how blessed we are because of Christ's willingness to come to this earth and be the sacrifice for our sins. Let's put our focus on what we DO have in Christ. Because in Christ, we have everything we need. We have nothing to complain about. All we can do is praise God continually for giving us life through His Son.
