## GOD IS GREATER THAN THE UPS AND DOWNS

Have you ever thought about how, in the grand scheme of things, the things that bother us are rather insignificant? Everything in life seems to be a matter of perspective, doesn't it?

I love the story that is told about Tug McGraw. McGraw was a pitcher for the New York Mets and the Philadelphia Phillies in the 1960s, 70s, and 80s. He had a wonderful philosophy on pitching. It was what he called his "frozen snowball" theory. He explained, "If I come in to pitch with the bases loaded and heavy hitter Willie Stargell (Hall of Fame 1st Baseman with the Pittsburgh Pirates) is at bat, there's no reason I want to throw the ball. But, eventually I have to pitch. So, I remind myself that in a few billion years the earth will become a frozen snowball hurtling through space, and nobody's going to care what Willie Stargell did with the bases loaded!"

What a tremendous perspective! Bases loaded with Hall of Famer Willie Stargell at bat - that is a huge dilemma for any pitcher - in that moment. When life comes to an end, what happened in that moment will have no importance in the grand scheme of things. The fact is - our perspective often determines how important we view something to be. If we were to change our perspective on something, we may see it as being more or less important than we previously did.

As we are finishing up the book of Genesis this week, we are finding out the rest of the story in the life of Joseph. Joseph's life is a whole series of ups and downs. While the high points in his life are pretty great, the low points were far worse than any normal human being would want to endure. I'm not going to take the time to summarize the whole story for you, after all you should have completed it by the end of today. However, as you read through these last chapters of Genesis and see the things Joseph endures and where he ends up; I want you to consider this statement Joseph makes at the end of the book: "You intended to harm me, but God intended it for good to accomplish what is now being done..." - (Genesis 50:20a).

Sometimes the things that tend to harm us the most are the things God is intending for a greater purpose later in life. My prayer is that God will help us to keep our eyes on him and his purposes through all the highs and lows of life. As someone once said, "God is greater than the ups and downs!
