# **REMEMBERING THE CREATOR IN OUR YOUTH**

#### "Remember also your Creator in the days of your youth..." - (Ecclesiastes 12:1a)

We talked about this verse on Sunday; and we recognized the need to commit to our Creator early in life. The difficulty in preaching a sermon on a topic like this, in a traditional church setting, is that usually the audience is mostly made up of adults who made a commitment to God a long time ago. The average church attender may be thinking, "That's great... but I've already done this. What's in this for me?"

I could spend my time commenting on the need to constantly renew our commitment to God (Romans 12:2); but I want to look at this in a different way.

Many of us can appreciate the benefits of committing to God early in life. Even those who committed later in life would say they wish they would have done so sooner. Life only gets more difficult the further into it we get. The sooner we can make our commitment to "Fear God and keep his commandments" (Ecclesiastes 12:13), the stronger our foundation will be for handling the difficulties of life.

We know how important it is to "Remember... [our] Creator in the days of [our] youth..." Now, if you are wondering what to do with that now - let me suggest that we look for ways to help today's youth make that same commitment. James Dobson has said, "We must make the salvation of our children our #1 priority. Nothing else is more important."

At the Kanawha City Church of Christ, we are committed to bringing our youth into a covenant relationship with their Creator. This is a task that demands the efforts of all members of the church. So, what opportunities are there to encourage a child's relationship with God?

- Teach a Bible School class
- Help with children's church
- Host/Chaperone a youth event
- Serve Sunday morning breakfast
- Drive the church van
- Volunteer as a "pew parent"
- Attend a child's extra-curricular event
- Stop and have a conversation with a child
- Learn something new about a child and find a way to respond (i.e. find out their favorite candy bar and get it for them)
- Get a list of all the kids in the youth group, and take some time to pray for each child specifically
- Ask Jacob what you can do to be involved in the youth ministry
- Show the children that they are valued members of this church body

Some of a child's earliest and most influential experiences with God will be in how they are treated by His body (the church). Let us all prayerfully search for ways to help a child develop their relationship with their Creator. Let us commit to teaching our youth this very basic, biblical truth: "Jesus loves the little children, all the children of the world!"
