# **CONFESSING SIN**

There is an old, morbid adage about being attacked by a bear while part of a group. The saying is, "I don't have to be faster than the bear, I just have to be faster than somebody else." The idea being that everyone else will get away while the slowest person gets attacked by a bear. It's weird and morbid; and hopefully none of us ever have to actually find out what we would do if we were attacked by a bear.

The truth, however, is that we are being attacked everyday by Satan. Satan wants nothing more than to catch us in his grasp and destroy us. (1 Peter 5:8) even says, "Be alert and of sober mind. Your enemy the devil prowls around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour."

Satan is trying to attack us like he is some sort of wild animal. He is trying to devour us. So, how do we escape his grasp? Unfortunately, too often we try to use this same reasoning with getting away from Satan as we joke about using with a bear. We spend far too little time working on our own sins, and far too much time critiquing everyone else's. The attitude that this reflects is that we will somehow get away from Satan's grasp if our sin just isn't as bad as someone else's. So, we begin to hide our own sins and magnify someone else's in hopes that it makes us look better.

Unfortunately, what may work in a bear attack does not work in a Satan attack. As a matter of fact, the opposite is true. The more we hide our own sins and magnify others, the tighter of a grip that Satan gets on us. The truth is that we all sin, and the way to salvation begins on the roads of confession and repentance. But, that requires us to acknowledge our own sins and see their severity. Satan's best attack is to convince us that our sin isn't all that bad. That we can just run away from his attack if we throw someone else in his path.

The fact is we all have sin in our life. To hide it is to just fall into Satan's path. The only way to escape the grasp of Satan is not to hide our sins, but to acknowledge our sins and to repent of them. It is only when we come to terms with our own sins that we can realize that true salvation comes not from running away from the Devil and escaping his attack - because he will always be attacking - true salvation comes from running down the paths of confession and repentance towards the Savior. Salvation comes not from recognizing other's sins and throwing them to the Devil. Salvation comes from recognizing our own sins and laying them at the cross.

Satan's attack is vicious and relentless. If we hide in our sins, we will be found and devoured. But, if we confess our sins and repent of them, Christ will carry us to safety. So, let us pray for ourselves and for each other that we will truthfully recognize our own sins and repent of them. Let's lay our sins at the cross and find salvation in Christ's mercy and grace.

"Whoever conceals their sins does not prosper, but the one who confesses and renounces them finds mercy." - (Proverbs 28:13)
