HOLY SPIRIT JOURNAL

"And Peter said to them, 'Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit." (Acts 2:38)

This past Sunday we began thinking about this idea of receiving the gift of the Holy Spirit upon our baptism. It is my intention to preach a series on the Holy Spirit early in 2019. Until then, I have given everyone an assignment to begin listening and watching for the voice and movement of the Holy Spirit. For those that were not here for the lesson, or would like to have the assignment in written form, I want to share this summary.

In Acts 13:1-3 we read, "Now there were in the church at Antioch prophets and teachers, Barnabas, Simeon who is called Niger, Lucius of Cyrene, Manaen a lifelong friend of Herod the tetrarch, and Saul. While they were worshiping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, 'Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them.' Then after fasting and praying they laid their hands on them and sent them off."

In this passage we read of the Holy Spirit speaking to the church at Antioch. The church were doing four things that, I believe, made them more receptive to hearing the Holy Spirit. These are four things that we should regularly be doing ourselves. The assignment is to start a journal reflecting upon these four things as we do them; and to look for the movement of the Holy Spirit in those activities. So, what are the four things?

- 1. They were together with others in the church.
- They were worshiping the Lord.
- They were fasting.
- 4. They were praying.

What we want to be doing over the next few months is to spend plenty of time doing each of these things. I am challenging all of us to reflect upon our time doing these things in a journal. Reflecting upon these things will help us to get the full benefit by understanding: what we did, why we did it, what we will continue, what we will change, and what benefit we received.

Here is the specific challenge I want to make to each one of us (myself included). I want each of us to go to the store and buy a notebook. In that notebook I want us to keep a journal. I want us to start journaling about our time with other believers. I want us to journal about our time spent in worship, both private and corporate. I want us to journal about our time spent fasting. And I want us to journal about our prayer life. With each of these activities I want us to answer these questions:

- How did I experience God's Holy Spirit in these moments?
- Did I see Him moving?
- Did I hear Him speaking?
- Did I feel His comfort?
- 5. Am I drawing closer or moving further away?

I want us to spend time watching, learning, listening, and receiving the gift of the Holy Spirit. Let's let Him tell us who He is and what He does, rather than the other way around. I believe when we do that, rather than tame His Spirit, He will unleash ours.
