STUFFED ANIMALS FOR CAMC

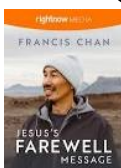


As you may have noticed from our foyer, the church is collecting stuffed animals to be used at CAMC Women & Children's Hospital's Child Advocacy Program.

UNION MISSION NEEDS/VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES 2023

Volunteer

1. Thanksgiving Distribution Food Sorting—Warehouse
2. Papa John Food Drive—(close to Thanksgiving)—Drivers/Volunteers needed for collecting, pick up and drop off of donated cans—day & eve
3. Drumstick Dash Fundraiser Event-5K race on Blvd. Haddad Riverfront Park-Thanksgiving Day morning-Volunteers needed for prep day/eve. Before & morning of race
4. Coat Drive Distribution & prep-October
5. Adopt-a-Family Distribution & prep-December
6. Christmas Shop for needy families-December
7. Prepare or serve an evening meal at our Men's Shelter
8. Landscaping—Spring/Summer
9. Woodshop-Volunteers needed to help cut small pieces of wood in our pallet shop (we sell these to make profit for our programs)

Donate-(money can be given or items can be dropped off)

1. Items for Homeless Blessing Bags-toiletries, small Bibles, non-perishable food (crackers, protein/granola bars, canned or dried fruit, beef jerky, beef sticks, nuts, canned tuna, water, etc.
2. Clothing, shoes, hats, gloves (seasonal), socks, etc. for our Men's Shelter.
3. Food for Families-Warehouse-Dry Goods (especially needed) or canned goods. Union Mission gives out boxes of food items daily.
4. Paper towels, toilet paper & trash bags.
5. Money needed to help support our Addiction Recovery Clients- Clothing, Driver's Licenses, other documents, classes (DUI, etc.), special outings, etc.
6. Money needed to support our Special Events—Coat Drive, Adopt-a-Family items & toys
7. Pre-school items or funds needed for Birthday items (recognizes each student), snacks, etc.
8. Money for our General Fund
