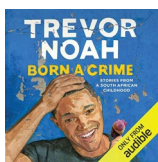
ANIMALS FOR CAMC CHILDREN

I was teaching a junior high Sunday school class about salvation and that age-old question, "Are you saved?" Before diving in, I asked the students what they collect and why.
