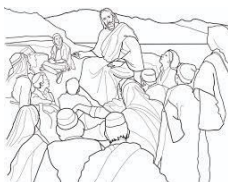

On **November 19**, we will **Connect For Prayer** - we will come together for a prayer service.

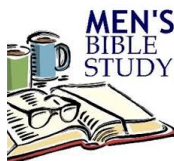
On **November 26**, we will **Connect For Worship** - we will spend time fellowshiping and worshipping God.

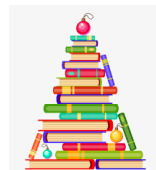

Thank you church. Earlier this year you generously supported the Wyatt family from Juneau Alaska while 14 year old Eli received cancer treatments at Seattle Children's. Dad Geoffrey is a school teacher and Mom Dana is a school principal. It was an expensive endeavor that necessitated one parent to live in Seattle for Eli's treatment while the other lived in Juneau with Eli's brother. Airplane tickets alone have been a huge expense. They've been through a lot. Thank you for supporting them. Here is Geoffrey Wyatt's CaringBridge journal from Oct. 26th:



It's the news we've been waiting for! After ringing the bell last week, we had to wait on one more blood test to make sure there would be no complications when they removed Eli's port. We went in this afternoon for the test and he let the blood be drawn like a pro. An hour later, we had the news that everything looked right for the port to come out. So, tomorrow afternoon he will have minor surgery to remove it! We will then come back to the Ronald McDonald House for some rest and we will be on a morning flight to Juneau! A special thank you to the person(s) who bought our return airline tickets. We appreciate your kindness and generosity.

We've done a serious amount of cleaning and packing [at Ronald McDonald House in Seattle]. Also, my sister and brother came for final visits. I've squeezed in a few walks around the neighborhood and said some goodbyes to people who have been helpful and supportive during our stay. Eli has continued to rest.

Eli still will have ongoing check-ups at home and will have to travel back to Seattle Childrens' every 3 months. He is also considered immunocompromised for at least 6 months so we will have to be careful about keeping him from getting sick. But, despite the drawbacks, we are ready!!
