The Book Club's next meeting will be on **Tuesday, February 27, at 6:00 pm** at Panera Bread, South Ridge, South Charleston.



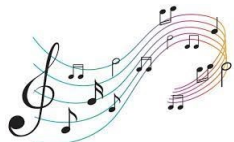
The book selection for February's discussion is *Finding Dorothy* by Elizabeth Letts.
